
A note to my fellow outdoors enthusiasts –

BAN LIFTED ON SUNDAY HUNTING

Following the passage of a state law that lifted the ban on Sunday hunting in the Commonwealth, the Pennsylvania Board of Game Commissioners approved 10 additional Sundays for hunting for the 2025-26 season. *Every Sunday through Dec. 7 will now be open for hunting*. The dates reflect all Sundays that fall within established hunting seasons, except for migratory game bird seasons, which are set through federal frameworks.

Pennsylvania's 850,000 licensed hunters will have greater flexibility to spend time outdoors. Hunting contributes more than \$1.6 billion each year to our state's economy; hopefully, this change for Sunday hunting will grow that figure. ATTENTION FIRST-TIME HUNTERS!

Hunter-Trapper Education courses are required for all first-time hunters and trappers before they can buy a license in the Commonwealth. The Pennsylvania Game Commission offers both in-person and online options. The course covers responsible hunting behavior, firearms basics and safety, basic shooting, wildlife conservation and management, outdoor safety and survival, hunting techniques, trapping and furtaking basics, and hunting safety. The following options are available:

- ✓ PGC's Basic Hunter-Trapper Education In-Person Course is offered free of charge to anyone age 11 and older. Classes are held at various locations across the Commonwealth. A schedule is available at *www.pgc.pa.gov*.
- ✓ The interactive online version of PGC's Basic Hunter-Trapper Education Course is offered to Pennsylvania residents age 11 and older. The fee for this course is \$49.95.
- ✓ PGC's official online course is offered to Pennsylvania residents age 16 or older. The fee for this course is \$34.95.
- ✓ The National Rifle Association offers a free online hunter education course to Pennsylvania residents age 11 and older.





LOCAL WATERWAYS PROVIDE FOR FANTASTIC FISHING

There is no de-bait-ing that Pennsylvania is great for trout fishing. Every spring, I enthusiastically volunteer to help the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission stock local waterways.

We've stocked trout locally in recent years, with some of them being more than 20 inches long.

The Fish and Boat Commission will host its *Fish for Free days on Sunday, May 24, and Saturday, July 4, in 2026.* No license is required, but all other fishing regulations still apply.

HUNTERS SHARING THE **HARVEST**

Did you know Pennsylvania has a venison donation program to help families in need?

Each season, Hunters Sharing the Harvest (HSH) aims to donate over 100,000 pounds of venison to the state's food banks, which then re-distribute it to more than 5,000 local provider charities such as food pantries, missions, homeless shelters, Salvation Army facilities and churches.

Since 1991, HSH has coordinated the processing and distribution of approximately 2.5 million pounds of donated venison. An average-sized deer will provide enough high-protein, low-fat meat for 200 servings. Thanks to program sponsors, hunters can donate venison at no charge.

DID YOU KNOW? SUMMER MEANS **TURKEY-COUNTING TIME!**

The Pennsylvania Game Commission often seeks public participation in surveying wild turkeys over the summer. Subscribe to my weekly eBlast (*RepOlsommer.com/email-signup*) or the Game Commission's website for information about the next survey period.

Participants are asked to record the number of wild turkeys they see, along with the county, township, wildlife management unit (WMU), date and contact information if agency biologists have any questions. Participants may also simply drop a "pin" on the map for the location data to automatically populate. Location data are used only for the survey, not for law enforcement and are not shared.

Participation is important for turkey population management. Survey data allow the agency to determine total wild turkey productivity and compare long-term reproductive success within Pennsylvania and across states, as this is a standard methodology used

across the country. Data are also used in the turkey population model to track population trends.

This can be your opportunity to talk turkey and help researchers at the same time.
